



Pivot Charter School Dress Code

Pivot Charter School believes a higher standard of dress code encourages students to have more respect for themselves and other students. Our dress code guidelines indicate appropriate school dress for normal school days. Pivot Charter School reserves the right to interpret these guidelines and/or make changes during the school year as needed. Therefore, every student who attends Pivot Charter School will wear the school uniform. Failure to wear any part of the school uniform will result in disciplinary action.

Students are expected to follow the below guidelines:

- ◆ **Shirts:** All shirts must be uniform shirts. A Uniform shirt is defined as red, black, or white polos (long or short sleeve). T-shirts can be worn underneath polo shirts. Sweatshirts and jackets, if worn, must have a zipper in the front and follow the same color theme as the polos. Zipper jackets will be sold at the school, however stores carry these basic styles. All zipper jackets must have a polo underneath. **No sweatshirts or hoodies are permitted.**
- ◆ **Pants:** All uniform pants, shorts, and skirts must be worn with a belt through the belt loops, (if belt loops are available), worn at the natural waist, be in good repair and have the appropriate size. Shorts and skirts must be 3 inches from the bend of the knee. Acceptable colors for uniform bottoms are black or khaki.
- ◆ **Belts:** Students are required to wear belts unless the bottom does not have loops. If loops are not available the shirt must be tucked into the bottom. Belts or belt buckles displaying offensive symbols, as deemed inappropriate by faculty or administration, are not to be worn. Chains are not permitted.
- ◆ **Shoes:** No house slippers.

No hats or bandanas

- ◆ **Exception:** Pivot Charter School may have special events which will allow for non-uniform days. (Advance notice will be sent out in regards to special event days.)

Students not wearing the appropriate uniform will be written up and progressive disciplinary actions will be taken for repeat offenders.

Although we tried to be specific to all dress code situation(s), there may be issues that are left to the discretion of the faculty and administration of the school.
